The Smart Village Initiative

- Participatory approach and community engagement is key in achieving results and create creative and resilient communities
- Bottom-up approach is crucial, but also requires engagement from the public sector (EU, national, local)
- There are many diverse and creative solutions (no one-size-fits-all solution)
- Many initiatives show that individualism is over everything is about community

The Smart Village Initiative

- Digitalisation should be used as a tool to provide access to new and inclusive opportunities (skills development and capacity building are necessary)
- Communities should work as a network, within the community, between communities and with experts

The Smart Village Initiative

- Simplicity, flexibility, less formal approaches, fast solutions (no duplication of plans, initiatives, structures, layers)
- Starting from small ideas to a larger scale
- Good governance means having the right actors at the right place, to develop a right list of priorities, involving local communities and identify proper funding

The Smart Village Initiative

- Smart Village concept benefits from synergies and plays a complementary role with other existing initiatives or instruments (such as LEADER)
- Agile and simple integration between funding opportunities
- Administrative setup should be simplified and streamlined
